To support the achievement of the Sustainable Development Goals, carry out humanitarian missions, support foreign policy, and support the empowerment of the national economy.

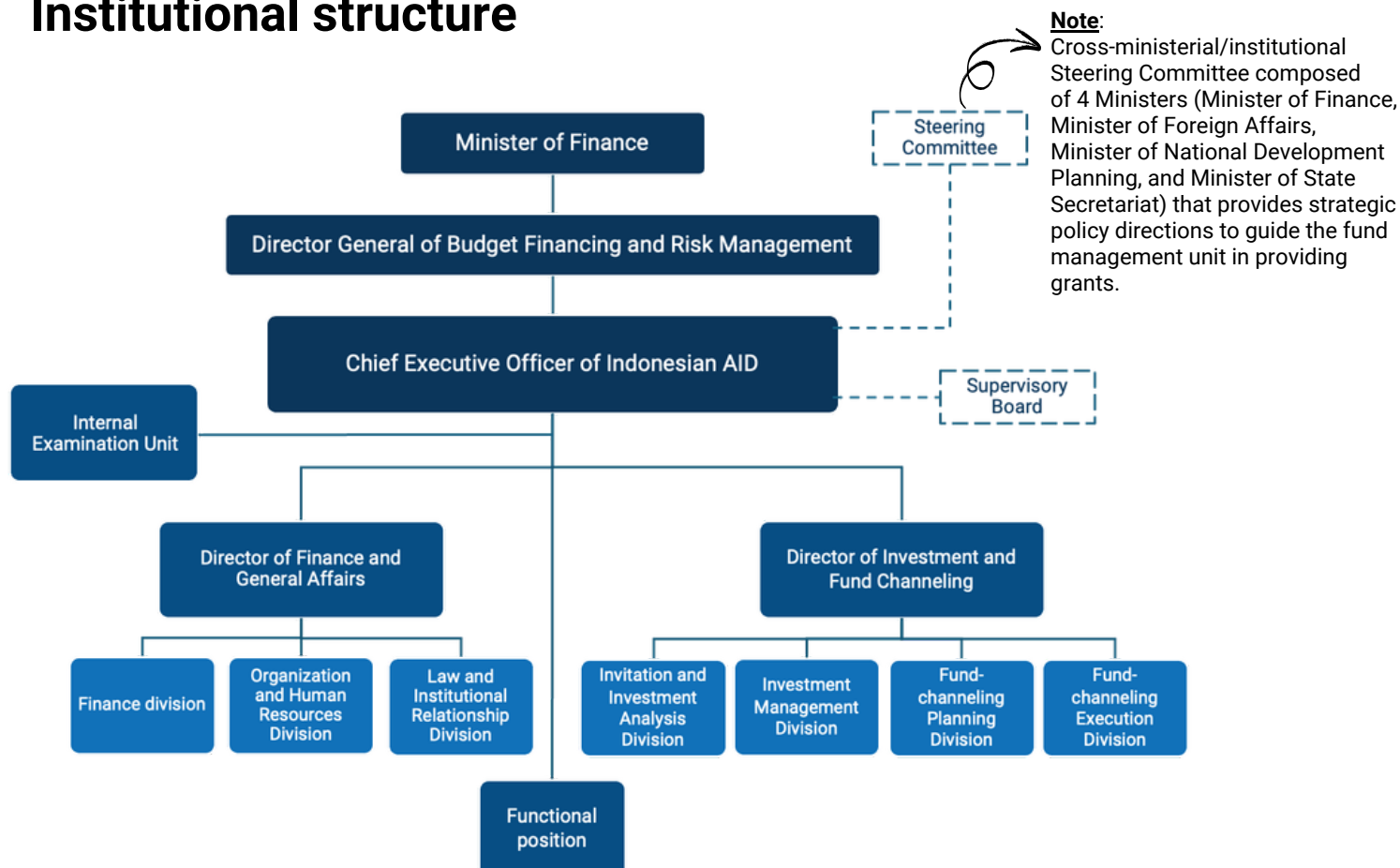
To promote independence in the management of international development cooperation funds through investment and partnerships

Highlights of activities

- In 2024, Indonesia pledged over USD 30 million for grant-funded projects supporting developing countries.
- Indonesia has facilitated over 30 bilateral and multilateral cooperation programs across sectors such as agriculture, disaster management, and education.
- Disaster risk reduction expertise was shared with Nepal and Sri Lanka, drawing on Indonesia's post-tsunami recovery experience.
- Indonesia partnered with Japan and Australia to implement blended funding for scaling up its food security and climate resilience initiatives
